Approximate tuition, fee and living expenses per month

For Visiting Students:

Tuition and Fees – Approximately \$12,500 per semester (excluding the international fee and health insurance and based on 12 credit hours)

Living Expenses include meals, educational materials, and other miscellaneous expenses in local currency - Approximately \$1,800 per month or more

For Research Interns:

Tuition and Fees – Approximately \$3,000-5,700 per semester (excluding the international fee and health insurance)

1 Course - \$3,000

2 Courses - \$5,700

Living Expenses include meals, educational materials, and other miscellaneous expenses in local currency - Approximately \$1,800 per month or more

For Exchange Students:

Tuition and Fees – An exchange student/special group of students will receive the special scholarship from College of Engineering; according to the bilateral agreement between two schools, he/she will not pay for tuition and fees – However, there are certain fees which are required for him/her to pay. That means he/she only needs to cover their living expenses (at least \$1,800 or more)

Your documents must be original, or true and attested copies, and less than six months old. You may send us a scanned copy of the original financial support documents that you will take to your American Embassy appointment when you apply for your visa. The minimum amount of financial sponsorship and support that must be shown on these original financial documents is \$44,000.00 for undergraduates and \$45,000.00 for graduate students. This is the estimated cost of tuition and fees, room and board, living expenses and miscellaneous costs for one year.
