Is your local insurance mandatory?	<b>Yes, it is mandatory for J1 visa holders to purchase UNLV's affiliated health insurance.</b> All the J-1 students and scholars need to purchase the required amount of health insurance coverage which is required by the U.S. Immigration Law. Please see the following information, particularly highlighted in yellow:  <i>The student (and their family if applicable) must maintain sufficient health insurance as defined by the University and federal guidelines for the entire duration of the student's program. As of May 15, 2015 those requirements are: Medical benefits of at least \$100,000 per accident or illness; repatriation of remains in the amount of \$25,000; medical evacuation in the amount of \$50,000; and deductibles not to exceed \$500 per accident or illness.</i>

The following information includes the detailed description of the required documents:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Evidence of Financial Support</li></ol> <p>* Original evidence of financial support for the estimated cost of tuition and other expenses incurred during your academic program. Your documents must be original, or true and attested copies, and less than six months old. You may send us a scanned copy of the original financial support documents that you will take to your American Embassy appointment when you apply for your visa. The minimum amount of financial sponsorship and support that must be shown on these original financial documents is \$45,000.00 for undergraduates and \$46,000.00 for graduate students. This is the estimated cost of tuition and fees, room and board, living expenses and miscellaneous costs for one year.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>2. Copy of Passport</li><li>3.
